Specimens & Pot Plants - Late entries close 10.30 am Friday, 3rd December.

Floriculture can be staged between 6.30 pm-8.30 pm Thursday 2nd December
and between 9.00 am-11.30 am Friday 3rd December.

Except for Floral Art, exhibitors must be prepared, if required,
to lodge a sworn declaration with the Secretary that the
Flowers and Plants are their bona fide property.

All exhibits are judged by qualified floriculture judges
in accordance with Australian Rules and Standards.

Specimen Section

1. A vase must be greater in height than in width.
2. Three cuts means three containers – one for each cut.
3. Containers are supplied.
4. NND = Not Necessarily Distinct.
5. Geraniums and pelargoniums should be staged with a leaf behind the flower.

Floral Art Section

- Horticultural material must predominate throughout.
- No artificial fruit or flowers whatsoever are permitted unless stated in Schedule.
- Foliage Designs. Unless otherwise specified these must only be foliage, no accessories, be it wood, sticks, or stones may be used. All stems should have leaves attached or they will be considered accessories.
- Maximum space allowed: is 75 cm wide and 60 cm deep. For an exhibit to be correctly placed, it should not take up more than two thirds (2/3) of this space as this allows the exhibit to be seen to best advantage by the judge.
- There are no other restrictions unless specifically stated.

Pot Plants

- A Pot Plant shall be defined as any plant successfully grown in a container or pot for decorative purposes.
- Plants must be grown and shown in pots not exceeding 30 cm in diameter unless otherwise specified.
- Hanging containers must not exceed 35 cm diameter.
- Multiple plantings must be distinct so that the judge may assess the number of plants present in the container.

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

(these form the Show Regulations and By-Laws)

The Osborne Park Agricultural Society Committee shall incur no responsibility by enforcing these regulations. The Society shall act and be further governed by the Uniform By-Laws of the Royal Agricultural Society of Western Australia, Inc.

All Entries received are subject to these Show Regulations and By-Laws, the Special Regulations in each Section and to the Uniform By-Laws made under The Royal Agricultural Society Act, 1926.

The Exhibition Hall will be open to the public on Friday evening, 3rd December from 6.00 pm to 8.00 pm and Saturday, 4th December from 10.00 am to 7.00 pm.

ADMISSION

1. Adults \$10.00, Pensioners & Students (must have student ID) \$7.00, Children \$5.00.
2. Members and Exhibitors on presentation of tickets will be admitted free to the grounds.

ENTRY FEES

3. The Entry Fee must in all cases be received with the entry.
4. The Entry Fee for Art & Photography; Budgerigars; Cage & Aviary Birds; Cooking; Floriculture; Fruit; Hobbies & Crafts; Jams, Pickles, Preserves & Honey; Pigeons and Vegetables is on a sliding scale: \$1.00 per entry for first 10 entries, 75 cents for entries 11 to 30, 50 cents for entries over 30.
5. The Entry Fee for Cats, Eggs, Goats, Horses in Action, Log Chopping, Poultry, Rabbits, School Exhibits and Stirling Fruit Cake can be found in the relevant Section details.
6. The Entry Fee for Children's Exhibits is 50 cents per entry. Must be aged 16 and under.

ENTRY FORMS

NOTE: For each entry the exhibitor will be issued a numbered ticket which will display the class number the article is entered into. The exhibitor must fix the ticket to the article entered into the class shown.

7. All entries are received subject to these Conditions of Entry
8. **Please ensure that a separate line is used for each entry.**
9. The Committee reserves the right of refusing, cancelling, or accepting conditionally any entry, without giving any reason for doing so.
10. **General entries close Monday, 8th November at 5.00 pm** (late entries will only be accepted for Cooking, Fruit and Vegetables which can be lodged at the Exhibition hall at the Showgrounds between 6.30 pm to 8.30 pm Thursday, 2nd December and 9.00 am to 11.00 am Friday, 3rd December.
11. Late entries for Floriculture may only be lodged on Thursday, 2nd December between 6.30 pm to 8.30 pm.
12. On lodgement of entries you will be given an admittance pass for Saturday, to permit you to see the exhibits, and to pick up your exhibits at 7.00 pm or the time specified for the section entered.
13. Every exhibit must be the bona-fide property of the exhibitor both at the time of entry and on the day of the Show, or as specified in the section entered.
14. The responsibility for the accuracy of the description of pedigree, and for the "eligibility to compete" of all animals entered in the various classes rests solely with the exhibitor. (Consult with Steward if unsure of correct class)
15. Entries and Fees can be left in the box provided at: Acciari's Gourmet Butcher and Deli, cnr Main & Cape St.; AMCAL Lottery Centre Newsagency, 85 Wanneroo Rd, Tuart Hill; Diamond Lock and Key 1/227 Main St; Greenwood Craft Centre, Shop 5/95 Wanneroo Rd; IGA 4/212 Main St. The owners have generously agreed to collect entries for us. ENTRIES FOR HORSES IN ACTION

16. Gate 1, Tyler St will be open at 6.00 am.
17. All entries must be lodged by 8th November.
18. Horses must be on the ground at least two hours before the advertised time of starting the event or competition in which they are entered.
19. No stallion will be allowed on the ground without approved headgear.
20. All male animals competing in the Breeding Classes must be visibly entire. All marks of spaying on females shall disqualify from competing in such classes.

JUDGING

21. Judging in Cooking; Jams, Pickles, Preserves & Honey; Floriculture; Fruit; Vegetables will commence at 12.30 pm Friday, 3rd December.
22. Judging in Hobbies & Crafts, Art & Photography will commence at 9.00 am on Wednesday, 1st December.
23. Judging in Budgerigars, Cage Birds, Cats, Eggs, Goats, Horses in Action, Log Chopping, Pigeons, Poultry, Rabbits, will commence from 9.00 am on Saturday, 4th December.
24. In the event of there being no competition in any class, prizes may be given if the Judges certify to particular merit; but they are specially requested to withhold prizes even where there is competition, if the exhibits are of inferior description, or not suitable for a class in which they are competing; they may award a second prize or third prize instead of a first, or may divide the prizes.
25. Champion awards: In making these awards, the Judges will only select from exhibits which have gained First prizes in classes eligible.

26. Reserve champions will be selected from the First and Second prize winners in their respective divisions.
27. No competing exhibit will be allowed to wear any ribbon, badge, or mark whilst being judged. (This does not refer to decorating ribbons, goat ear-marks, or ear-discs.)

TROPHIES

28. The Society offers trophies for different awards as described in each section of the schedule. Trophies will be presented at the Society's annual presentation evening held in May/June each year.
29. It is the responsibility of all Section Co-ordinators to provide the Secretary with the names and addresses of all trophy winners before leaving the ground. Failure to do this will mean that invitations may not be issued for the trophy night.
30. A trophy will be donated by the Committee to recognise the achievement of the exhibitor who gains the most points at the show.
31. Trophy winners are reminded that a short note of thanks to the Award donor would be appreciated. If you do not have the address, letters may be left with the Show Co-Coordinator.

ARRANGEMENT OF EXHIBITS

32. The arrangements as to position, classifications and grouping of exhibits shall be under the control of the Hall Steward
33. All Award Cards will be arranged with the approval of the Hall Steward

CONTROL OF EXHIBITS

34. One Award Card only is issued for each prize won.
35. No exhibit shall be removed before 7.00 pm. Exceptions: livestock (5.00 pm), Horses In Action (when classes finished). Earlier removal must have the written consent of the Show Co-Ordinator.
36. Exhibitors shall arrange their exhibits as directed by the Stewards, and no exhibit shall afterwards be moved without the sanction of the Steward, under penalty of disqualification.
37. The owner or exhibitor of an exhibit, or stand of exhibits, disapproved of as an exhibit by the Committee must, immediately upon notice to that effect, remove such exhibit or stand of exhibits, from the ground.
38. Exhibitors will render themselves liable to disqualification of the exhibit by either refusing to follow instructions or by removing any official placard, ticket, sash or ribbon affixed or posted by the Stewards.

DANGEROUS OR DISEASED EXHIBITS

39. Should the Committee have any reason to suspect that any exhibit is dangerous or objectionable, they may have same removed from, or refused admission to, the grounds.

PROTESTS

40. All protests must be given in writing to the Secretary accompanied by a fee of \$50.00 on or before 6.30 pm on Saturday, 4th December. The money shall be absolutely forfeited to the funds of the Society if the protest be deemed, on due consideration, unfounded or frivolous.

DISQUALIFICATION

41. An exhibitor giving a wrong description of his or her exhibit with the intention of deceiving or defrauding the Society shall be disqualified from exhibiting at any future Show, and the particulars of the case shall be published in the minutes of the Society. Exhibitors will be required to make a statutory declaration regarding their entries if the Committee so desires.
42. No person who has been disqualified from exhibiting at any Show of The Royal Agricultural Society of Western Australia Inc. or at any Show of any Society affiliated therewith shall during the period of disqualification be allowed to act as agent, representative or employee of any exhibitor at any Show of the Society.
43. During the period of disqualification no entry will be received from any person disqualified by The Royal Agricultural Society of Western Australia Inc. or by any Society affiliated therewith, and should any entry be accidentally accepted it shall be deemed to be void and the entry fee will be returned.
44. The Committee reserves the power to reject or remove any exhibitor, employee or attendant, or any visitor, from the Show, without being required to give any explanation or being liable for compensation.
45. The Committee reserves the right to postpone, and further postpone, the Show from the advertised date, and make what alterations they deem advisable in the Schedule of Prizes or other Show arrangements.
46. The decision of the Committee on all points shall be final without recourse.

GENERAL

47. Every reasonable care will be taken of exhibits, but no responsibility will be incurred by the Society. Ordinary precautions will be taken to guard against fire, and to protect the property of the Society and Exhibitors, but exhibits will not be insured at the cost of the Society.
48. The Society will not be responsible for any accident that may be caused through or by the exhibit or exhibitor, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the Society blameless and indemnified against any legal proceedings from such accidents.
49. Persons contravening any of the Society's Rules or Regulations shall forfeit any prize money which may be awarded to them.
50. No entertainment shall be allowed on the ground without special permission.
51. The holding of raffles on the show ground is not permitted
52. The sales and use of water pistols, fireworks or sparklers is strictly forbidden on the show ground (except for the organised firework event)
53. No dogs, pets or unauthorised animals allowed on the grounds except for Competition.

PRIVACY STATEMENT

The information provided by you in your Application for Entry is collected and used by the OPAS to organise and conduct competitions at the OPAS Annual Show. The OPAS may publish details such as your name, suburb and entry details in any OPAS publication including websites or communications. Such information may also be made available to and published by the media. OPAS may also use your contact details to contact you about future shows. The OPAS will not

disclose your personal information without your consent for any other purpose, unless required or authorised by law.
